# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The 2000 Court Statistics Report is now published electronically as part of the Administrative Office of the Courts' (AOC) effort to modernize the dissemination of state court workload data and make court information more accessible and easier to review. It contains 10-year statewide trend data as well as fiscal year 1998–99 data for individual counties. (The limited-edition printed version of this report contains primarily statewide data.)

The *Court Statistics Report* is prepared by the AOC pursuant to the provisions of article VI, section 6 of the California Constitution, which requires the Judicial Council to survey the condition of business in the state courts and to report and make recommendations to the Governor and Legislature.

# **Trial Court Unification**

On June 2, 1998, California voters approved Proposition 220, a constitutional amendment that permitted the judges in each county to decide whether to merge their superior and municipal courts into a single unified superior court. As of the date of this report, unification was in effect in 55 of the state's 58 counties. All data in this report reflect court unification. The "Trial Courts" section replaces the separate superior and municipal court sections in past reports.

# **Principal Findings**

Court filing and disposition data represent key measures of court workload, but other factors also must be considered. For example, the filing of a complex case may result in numerous court appearances and actions, while a simple case may be resolved in a single appearance of less than one hour. Yet both types of cases are considered single filings and thus appear equal in terms of their impacts on the court. Examples of complex cases include felonies, personal injuries, and family relations matters, such as custody and juvenile dependency.

Principal findings in this report include the following:

### SUPREME COURT

- Total dispositions reached 8,608 in fiscal year 1998–99, 5 percent more than in the previous fiscal year and 21 percent more than the average for the previous five years. For every 100 filings in 1998–99, the court disposed of 104 cases. This is the first year since 1994–95 in which dispositions exceeded filings in the Supreme Court.
- Total filings reached 8,310 in 1998–99, 4 percent less than the year before and 15 percent more than the average for the previous five years.
- The court issued 88 written opinions in 1998–99, slightly below its five-year average of 95.4 opinions per fiscal year.
- Dispositions of petitions for review fell 2 percent, from 5,611 in 1997–98 to 5,487 in 1998–99.
- Filings of original proceedings rose 6 percent, to 2,688. Original proceedings are one of the fastest-growing areas of work for the Supreme Court, having increased by more than 70 percent over the last five years.
- Dispositions of automatic appeals (death penalty cases) fell to 9 in fiscal year 1998–99 compared with the court's five-year average of 14 per year. (An average opinion in an automatic appeal analyzes over three times more issues than an average opinion in all other case categories.) Dispositions of habeas corpus petitions related to automatic appeals totaled 36, exceeding the five-year average of 31 petitions per year.

### **COURTS OF APPEAL**

- Filings of records of appeal were 16,186 in 1998–99, compared with 15,931 in 1997–98, an increase of 2 percent. While criminal filings declined by almost 5 percent, juvenile filings rose by 16 percent and civil filings rose by 5 percent.
- Filings of original proceedings fell 2 percent, from 9,116 in 1997–98 to 8,915 in 1998–99. This decline is due to a 10 percent decrease in the filings of civil original proceedings. Both juvenile original proceedings and criminal original proceedings rose during the same period, criminal by 3 percent and juvenile by 9 percent.
- For the first time in a decade, dispositions by written opinion fell in 1998–99, declining 4 percent to 13,701 from 14,238 in 1997–98. Of these, the number of written opinions fell in both civil and criminal cases while rising slightly in juvenile cases. Dispositions by written opinion declined 4 percent in civil cases and 7 percent in criminal but rose by 8 percent in juvenile cases.

### TRIAL COURTS

- More than 8.6 million cases were filed in trial courts in 1998–99, up less than 0.1 percent over the previous year and down 1.3 percent in the past five years.<sup>1</sup>
- Total criminal filings increased 2 percent, from 6,744,264 in 1997–98 to 6,861,200 in 1998–99.
- Personal injury, property damage, and wrongful death filings rose 2 percent to 69,666.<sup>2</sup>
- Combined domestic-related filings (family law, juvenile dependency, and other civil petitions) declined 4 percent from 1997–98 levels, after climbing to a high of 645,433 filings in 1995–96.<sup>3</sup> Despite the decline in recent years, filings in this category remain 34 percent above their level a decade ago.
- Driving under the influence, reckless driving causing injury, and hit-and-run misdemeanor filings rose 3.5 percent over last year, from 191,034 to 197,727. However, filings in this category have declined 42 percent during the last decade.
- Felony jury trials increased by 8 percent, from 5,412 in 1997–98 to 5,847 in 1998–99. Jury trials accounted for 2.8 percent of felony dispositions in 1998–99.
- Misdemeanor jury trials increased 17 percent, from 5,018 in 1997–98 to 5,863 in 1998–99.
- Civil jury trials declined 1 percent, from 4,357 in 1997–98 to 4,315 in 1998–99.<sup>4</sup>
- Case-processing times for civil cases improved. Fifty-nine percent of general civil cases in 1998–99 were disposed of within one year of filing, an improvement over fiscal year 1994–95, when only 49 percent were disposed of within that time frame. Similarly, 88 percent of general civil cases in 1998–99 were disposed of within two years of filing, compared with only 77 percent in 1994–95. Case-processing time also improved for limited-jurisdiction civil cases, unlawful detainer cases, and small claims cases.

### JUDICIAL ASSIGNMENTS

- In 1998–99, total judicial assistance received from retired judges, Court of Appeal justices, and trial court judges declined 13 percent, from 29,010 days the previous fiscal year to 25,211 days.
- Of the judicial assistance provided, 97 percent came from retired judges, 3 percent from trial court judges, and less than 1 percent from Court of Appeal justices.

# PROFILE OF THE CALIFORNIA JUDICIAL SYSTEM


As of June 30, 1999, the California judicial system consisted of the Supreme Court, six districts of the Court of Appeal, and 64 trial courts with 1,479 authorized judgeships. (The judgeships referred to in this report are authorized positions.) The names of judges of the Supreme Court, Courts of Appeal, and superior courts are listed in the *California Official Reports*.

Nearly 8.7 million cases were filed during fiscal year 1998–99. Judicial system costs in 1998–99, not including capital outlay for facilities, totaled \$2 billion. Counties contributed \$779 million, or 39 percent of total court funding, to the state as their share for 1998–99. In 1999–00, their share will drop to \$681 million, or 34 percent, based on projected total expenditures. The balance of 1998–99 judicial system costs was funded by the state.

The California Constitution vests the judicial power of the state in a Supreme Court, Courts of Appeal, superior courts, and municipal courts. (Cal. Const., art. VI, § 1.) The superior and municipal courts are the state's trial courts; the Supreme Court and Courts of Appeal are appellate courts that primarily review trial court decisions.

The Constitution also provides for three agencies concerned with judicial administration: the Judicial Council, which improves the administration of justice (Cal. Const., art. VI, § 6); the Commission on Judicial Appointments, which votes to confirm gubernatorial appointees to appellate court vacancies (Cal. Const., art. VI, §§ 7, 16); and the Commission on Judicial Performance, which deals with the admonishment, censure, removal, or retirement of judges for misconduct or disability (Cal. Const., art. VI, §§ 8, 18).


Line of Appeal




FIGURE 2-Automatic Appeals Filed Fiscal Years 1989–90 through 1998–99



*People v. Zamudio*, S074414 (Los Angeles Co. Superior Court no. VA036217) The court granted the superior court clerk's request for an extension of time to complete the clerk's transcript on appeal. The municipal court clerk failed to timely deliver the record to the superior court clerk.

*People v. Charles Chitat Ng*, S080276 (Orange Co. Superior Court no. 94ZF0195) The court granted the superior court clerk's request for an extension of time to complete the clerk's transcript of appeal, citing the voluminous record in excess of 10,000 pages.

# Figure 1

- The ratio of pending fully briefed appeals to appeals disposed of by written opinion is a measure of pending workload as well as judicial productivity. The ratio is an estimate of time a court needs to dispose of pending fully briefed appeals. A ratio of 100 is equivalent to one year, 50 is equivalent to six months, and so forth. The estimate is based on the assumption that the court will decide the same number of appeals in 1999–2000 as in 1998–99.
- The Second District had 26 fully briefed appeals per 100 appeals disposed of by opinions in 1998–99, the lowest ratio among the six appellate districts. Given the assumption noted above, it would take three months for the court to dispose of its pending fully briefed appeals.
- The Fifth District had 80 pending fully briefed appeals per 100 appeals disposed of by opinion, the highest among the six appellate districts.
- The statewide average increased from 45 to 46 pending fully briefed appeals per 100 appeals disposed of by opinion.




- The Fifth District reported the highest number of pending fully briefed appeals per authorized justice, 114.
- The First District reported the lowest number of pending fully briefed appeals per authorized justice, 36.



- "Judge-equivalent" refers to the number of authorized justices, adjusted for judicial vacancies, assistance given to other courts, and judicial assistance received.
- The statewide average of opinions per judge-equivalent was 144 in 1998–99, compared to 146 in 1997–98.
- The Fourth District reported the highest rate, 168 opinions per judge-equivalent — 17 percent higher than the statewide average.
- The First District reported the lowest opinion rate, 91 per judge-equivalent. However, the First District had the lowest number of pending fully briefed appeals per authorized justice. The lower disposition rate may reflect that fewer cases are available for the justices.
- Beyond an optimum number of opinions (not yet identified), high rates of disposition indicate overload and a need for additional judgeships.


### FIGURE 2-Pending Fully Briefed Appeals Per Authorized Justice As of June 30, 1999








#### FIGURE 4-A-Time (in Days) from Notice of Appeal to Filing of Opinion for Civil Appeals Median and 90th Percentile Fiscal Year 1998–99

- White portions of the bars represent the medians. The entire length of the bar (white plus dark portions) represents the 90th percentile. "Median time" refers to the value at which half of the cases fall above and half below. The 90th percentile time is the value at which 10 percent of the cases fall above and 90 percent fall below.
- Statewide median time from appeal to filing of opinion for civil appeals was 498 days in 1998–99, compared to 516 days in 1997–98; 90th percentile time was 947 days in 1998–99, compared to 995 days in 1997–98.
- Division Three of the Fourth District reported 1,302 days, the longest 90th percentile time from notice of appeal to filing of opinion for civil appeals disposed of in 1998–99.
- Division Five of the First District had the shortest 90th percentile time from notice of appeal to opinion for civil appeals, 515 days.

# Figure 4-B

- Statewide median time from appeal to filing of opinions for criminal appeals was 416 days in 1998–99, compared to 410 days in 1997–98; 90th percentile time was 685 days in 1998–99, compared to 659 days in 1997–98.
- Division Three of the Fourth District had the longest 90th percentile time from notice of appeal to filing of opinion for criminal appeals disposed of in 1998–99, 900 days.
- Division Five of the First District had the shortest 90th percentile time for criminal appeals, 512 days.




FIGURE 5-Caseload Comparison Per Authorized Justice









FIGURE 9-Record of Appeal Filings In the Second District Fiscal Years 1989–90 through 1998–99



# **TRIAL COURTS**

On June 2, 1998, California voters approved Proposition 220, a constitutional amendment that permitted the judges in each county to decide whether to merge their superior and municipal courts into a single unified superior court. As of the date of this report, unification was in effect in 55 of the state's 58 counties. All data in this report reflects the court unification environment. This "Trial Courts" section replaces the separate superior and municipal court sections in past reports.













VI, § 6), California trial courts are required to submit Summary Reports 1A and 2A, Addendum 1D and 1E Reports, Form 2C, and Report of Assistance to the Judicial Council on a monthly basis. Judicial Position Reports are required each quarter. Summary Reports contain case filing and disposition data, 1A for general jurisdiction cases and 2A for limited jurisdiction cases. Addendum Reports and Form 2C are used to calculate case processing time for general and limited jurisdiction cases respectively. The Report of Assistance and Judicial Position Report are used to calculate judicial position equivalents.

### **APPENDIX B: SUPREME COURT GLOSSARY**

The definitions provided in this glossary are intended only to provide context and a general understanding of the information contained in this publication. These definitions are not to be relied on as legal authority or cited as authoritative.

### **Attorney Disciplinary Proceedings.**

Proceedings concerning possible suspension, disbarment, and public or private reproval of attorneys for alleged violations of law or rules of professional conduct. Recommendations of the State Bar are reviewed by the Supreme Court as a matter of course. Also include proceedings in which opinions were issued on petitions by attorneys for full review of State Bar recommendations and on petitions for reinstatement from previously disbarred attorneys. Supreme Court practice as to review of the State Bar's recommendations is changing.

Automatic Appeal. Criminal appeal by operation of law directly from a superior court to the Supreme Court upon imposition of a death penalty sentence.

**Civil.** An appeal or original proceeding concerning a case that is neither a criminal nor a juvenile deliquency proceeding.

**Criminal.** An appeal or original proceeding related to a case charging the violation of criminal law.

**Original Proceedings.** Petitions for writs within the Supreme Court's original jurisdiction. The most common types are mandamus and prohibition, which may relate to either civil or criminal matters, and habeas corpus. **Petition for Review.** Request for Supreme Court review of a Court of Appeal decision.

**Petition for Review Denied.** Order by the Supreme Court declining review of a Court of Appeal decision.

**Petition for Review Granted.** Order by the Supreme Court granting review of a Court of Appeal decision.

### Petition for Review Granted and

**Held.** Order by the Supreme Court granting review of a Court of Appeal decision that will be held until a lead case addressing a related issue has been decided by the Supreme Court.

### Petition for Review Granted and

**Transferred.** Order by the Supreme Court granting review of a Court of Appeal decision but transferring review of the case to a Court of Appeal without additional action by the Supreme Court.

### **Request for Publication or**

**Depublication.** A case in which the sole relief requested is for the Supreme Court to order a Court of Appeal decision to be either published or depublished.

Written Opinion. The written decision, with reasons stated, that determines the outcome of a Supreme Court case. For each case or group of consolidated cases, only one opinion is reported in these tables. Concurring and dissenting opinions are not included.

### APPENDIX C: COURTS OF APPEAL GLOSSARY

The definitions provided in this glossary are intended only to provide context and a general understanding of the information contained in this publication. These definitions are not to be relied on as legal authority or cited as authoritative.

**Appeal.** A proceeding for direct review of a judgment or appealable order of a trial court. Excludes collateral review by means of an original proceeding. (See *Civil Appeal* and *Criminal Appeal*.)

**Civil Appeal.** An appeal in a case that is neither a criminal nor a juvenile delinquency proceeding.

**Civil Original Proceeding.** Any original proceeding in which the underlying case does not relate to a violation of criminal law.

**Court of Appeal.** The California court that hears appeals in all cases in which a superior court has original jurisdiction, except capital cases, and appeals in other special circumstances as prescribed by law.

**Criminal Appeal.** An appeal from the judgment or order in a case charging a violation of criminal law.

**Criminal Original Proceeding.** Any original proceeding in which the underlying case is related to a violation of criminal law.

**Disposition.** Termination of an appeal or original proceeding. Court of Appeal dispositions are either by written opinion or without opinion with or without record filed. **Fully Briefed.** A pending appeal in which all briefs have been filed.

**Median Time.** In a listing where time values are placed in order from shortest to longest, the value with half the cases above and half the cases below it.

**Ninetieth Percentile Time.** In a listing where time values are placed in order from shortest to longest, the value with 10 percent of the cases above it and 90 percent below.

**Notice Filed.** The filing of a Notice of Appeal in the superior court, thereby initiating the appellate process.

**Original Proceedings.** Cases commenced in an appellate court, commonly called "writ proceedings." The most common are writs of mandamus and prohibition, usually seeking an order addressed to a lower court, and writs of habeas corpus, usually addressed to a person holding another in official custody. (See *Civil Original Proceeding* and *Criminal Original Proceeding*.)

**Pending Appeal.** An appeal awaiting decision.

**Record Filed.** The filing of the trial court clerk's transcript (copies of documents filed in the case) and the reporter's transcript (typed version of oral proceedings).

## APPENDIX D: TRIAL COURTS GLOSSARY

The definitions provided in this glossary are intended only to provide context and a general understanding of the information contained in this publication. These definitions are not to be relied on as legal authority or cited as authoritative.

**Appeal.** A proceeding for direct review of a civil or criminal judgment from a limitedjurisdiction case, including small claims matters.

**Civil Limited.** All civil matters with a value of \$25,000 or less, except small claims matters.

**Commissioner.** A substitute judicial officer, employed by a county, who performs judicial or quasi-judicial duties assigned to him or her by a court. A commissioner may be authorized to decide only limited pretrial issues of fact and law or to conduct complete trials. Commissioners frequently act as temporary judges.

**Disposition.** Termination of a proceeding. Civil dispositions *before trial* include transfers to another trial court, dismissals, summary judgments, and other judgments before trial. Criminal dispositions *before trial* include transfers to another trial court, sentences after pleas of guilty or no contest, and dismissals. Civil dispositions *after trial* include acquittals, grants of probation, and sentences after conviction.

**Family Law.** A proceeding in which a petition has been filed for dissolution or voiding of a marriage or for legal separation.

**Felony.** Criminal case alleging an offense punishable by

imprisonment in a state prison or by death.

**Filings in Civil Matters.** The number of civil cases for which complaints or petitions have been filed.

**Filings in Criminal Matters.** The number of defendants against whom criminal charges have been filed.

**Filings in Juvenile Matters.** The number of minors who are the subject of petitions.

### Group A Misdemeanors.

Nontraffic misdemeanor violations of the Penal Code and other state statutes, excluding Fish and Game Code violations and intoxication complaints.

### Group B Misdemeanors.

Nontraffic misdemeanor violations of local city and county ordinances, Fish and Game Code violations, and intoxication complaints.

### Group C Misdemeanors.

Violations of Vehicle Code sections 20002 (hit and run, property damage), 23104 (reckless driving, causing injury), and 23152 (driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs).

**Group D Misdemeanors.** All traffic misdemeanor violations that are not included in the Group C misdemeanor category.

**Illegal Parking.** All violations of parking regulations established by state statutes and local ordinances.

**Judgeship.** The judicial position with power to exercise the full legal authority of the court in which the judge sits by selection or assignment. The number of positions authorized by law, whether filled or vacant.

### Judicial Position Equivalents.

Estimate of the number of judicial officers who were present and available to conduct court business. The numbers include authorized judgeships, adjusted to reflect judicial vacancies and assistance given to other courts; and assistance received from assigned judges, full-time and part-time commissioners and referees, and temporary judges serving by stipulation of the parties; they exclude assistance provided under blanket assignments.

**Judicial Positions.** The number of judgeships authorized by law, plus referees and commissioners.

# **APPENDIX D: TRIAL COURTS GLOSSARY** (continued)

### **Juvenile Delinquency**

**Proceedings.** Petitions filed under Welfare and Institutions Code section 602 alleging violation of a criminal statute, and the number of petitions filed under Welfare and Institutions Code section 601, alleging that a minor is beyond the control of parents or guardians but has not violated any law. Prior to 1977 both sections were referred to as delinquency. An original *petition* commences a delinquency proceeding. A subsequent petition adds allegations against a minor child who is already subject to the court's jurisdiction.

### **Juvenile Dependency**

**Proceedings.** Petitions filed under Welfare and Institutions Code section 300 seeking to make a minor child a ward of the court because of abuse or neglect. An *original petition* commences a dependency proceeding. A *subsequent petition* adds allegations regarding a minor child who is already subject to the court's jurisdiction.

### Mental Health Proceedings.

Selected proceedings to detain a person under the Lanterman-Petris-Short Act; proceedings to examine or detain a person as a mentally retarded individual, a narcotic addict, a mentally disordered prisoner at the time of parole or termination of parole, or a mentally disordered sex offender for a crime committed before January 1, 1982; and proceedings to determine the current sanity of a criminal defendant.

Motor Vehicle Personal Injury, Death, and Property Damage. Actions for damages in excess of \$25,000 for physical injury to persons and property and actions for wrongful death *related only to* motor vehicle accidents.

**Nontraffic Infraction.** Nontraffic violation of state statutes or local ordinances specified as infractions.

**Other Civil Complaints.** Cases not covered in any other civil case category, including complaints filed by a private party to establish paternal relationship. If the requested relief is for money, it must be in excess of \$25,000 to be filed as a general jurisdiction case.

Other Civil Petitions. Petitions for adoption, for change of name, to establish the fact of birth or death (if not part of a pending probate proceeding); petitions filed by the district attorney against a parent responsible for child support reimbursement to the county; petitions filed under the Reciprocal Enforcement of Support Act; petitions to prevent domestic violence; and other special proceedings.

**Personal Injury, Death, and Property Damage.** All actions for damages in excess of \$25,000 for physical injury to persons and property and actions for wrongful death.


**Probate and Guardianship.** All probate proceedings, will contests, guardianship and conservatorship proceedings (including conservatorship proceedings under the Lanterman-Petris-Short Act), and petitions to compromise minors' claims (when not part of a pending action or proceeding).

**Reduced to Misdemeanor.** Cases in which a charge originally filed as a felony is disposed of as a misdemeanor.

**Referee.** Subordinate judicial officer employed by a county, handling matters assigned by the court such as traffic law violations.

**Small Claims.** All matters filed in small claims court (value of \$5,000 or less). (The jurisdictional limit increased from \$2,500 to \$5,000 effective January 1, 1991.)

**Traffic Infraction.** Any trafficrelated violation of state statute or city or county ordinances specified as infractions, but excluding parking violations.
