

Humility Embraces:

- a willingness to openly assess oneself
- acceptance of **one's limitations**
- acknowledging gaps in one's knowledge
- openness to new & contradictory ideas

Cultural Humility Involves:

- a) A lifelong process
- b) Serious self-reflection and self-critique
- c) A commitment to respecting different viewpoints
- e) Engaging with others from a place of learning
- f) An attitude that acknowledges that culture is individual & can only be understood individually

Culturally Humble Practice:

"Those who practice cultural humility work to increase self-awareness of their own biases and perceptions and engage in a life-long process of self reflection about how to put these aside and learn from clients."
