### Title: Strategic Evaluation Committee Report

The Strategic Evaluation Committee (SEC) was appointed by Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye in March 2011 to conduct an in-depth review of the AOC with a view toward promoting transparency, accountability, and efficiency. ## Commenting on behalf of an organization

*General Comment:* I write to urge the Judicial Council to endorse the SEC Report and to implement its recommendations expeditiously. The SEC was a well-balanced committee of hard working and thoughtful judges from around the state who performed an in-depth and excellent analysis of AOC operations before reaching its wide-ranging recommendations. The AOC cannot continue to operate without the confidence of trial court judges throughout the state, and must be restructured and fundamentally changed so that it can perform its function as a "service provider" to the courts, not as an overstaffed and budgeted drain on judicial resources. It is therefore critical for the operation of the trial courts statewide that these recommendations be implemented.

In particular, the Chapter 4 recommendations must be implemented immediately so that (1) the Judicial Council takes an active role in overseeing and monitoring the AOC to insure "transparency, accountability and efficiency"; (2) the AOC define its primary role as the "service provider to the Judicial Council and the courts"; (3) the AOC provide the Judicial Council with a business case analysis for its operations and practices; and (4) the Judicial Council conduct periodic reviews of the performance of the Administrative Director, taking into account input from judges and courts around the state, among others.

All comments will become part of the public record.

In addition, all the SEC recommendations should be implemented as quickly as possible to put the AOC back on track in its service to the Court and to restore the confidence in the AOC that is necessary for it to be effective. Finally, I support the recommendation of Presiding Judge Lee Smalley Edmon that the Judicial Council assign to the judicial members of the SEC the task of regular and public reports to the Council regarding implementation and monitoring of the SEC recommendations.
