General Comment: The Chief was couragious to commission the SEC. It will require even greater courage to implement the SEC recommendations. I suggest that the recommendations be ranked in order of priority and feasibility, and I urge that they be implemented forthwith. I also respectfully suggest that in the ranking process, one of the most cumbersome recommendations be placed high on the priority list: moving the AOC to Sacramento. Not only will the move save money for salaries and rental costs, but also, and more important, it will foster relationships and cooperation with staff in other branches of government. The past isolation and imperious culture of the AOC was, in large part, due to its isolation from the courts it was supposed to serve, and from the other branches of government whose expertise and information should have been accessed by AOC staff and management for the benefit of all. Moving the AOC will go a long way to curing its greatest challenge - reforming its culture.

The SEC is a thorough, well-vetted and broadly supported analysis of the problems and recommended solutions. It does not contain all the solutions, but it is a solid, credible, well-supported start. If we fail to act, if we dither and discuss without moving forward, we will fail, and we will deserve the contempt for the judiciary that will inevitably follow inaction.
