Proposition 64 PASSED	Unfair Competition Law: Limits an individual's right to sue under the unfair competition laws by requiring that the individual actually incurred injuries, and suffered financial/property loss because of, the unfair business practice.	58.9%	41.1%
Proposition 66 FAILED	Three Strikes: Amends the "Three Strikes" law by requiring that increased sentences be given only for violent and/or serious felonies. Additionally, the proposition redefines what constitutes a violent and/or serious felony, and requires increased punishment for specified sex crimes against children.	46.6%	53.4%
Proposition 69 PASSED	DNA Samples: Requires the collection of DNA samples from all felons, adults and juveniles that are arrested for or charged with specified crimes. The proposition further requires that, in five years, DNA samples be taken from adults arrested for or charged with any felony.	61.8%	38.2%
Proposition 1A PASSED	Protection of Local Government Revenues: Protects local funding for public safety, health, libraries, parks, and other locally delivered services. Also, prohibits the State from reducing local governments' property tax proceeds, and stipulates that these provisions may only be suspended if the Governor declares a fiscal necessity and two-thirds of the Legislature approves the suspension. The proposition additionally requires the State to fund legislative mandates imposed on local governments or suspend their operation.	83.6%	16.4%
