Unfortunately, voluntary EJTs have not been utilized very often since their inception, despite significant educational and outreach efforts directed to the bench and bar promoting the program. This led to the passage of AB 555 (Stats. 2015, ch. 330) requiring expedited jury trials in most limited civil cases. A preliminary survey of the courts regarding both EJTs and MEJTs showed positive results in terms of equitable outcomes.
