Invitation to Comment

Rule 10.41(b) of the California Rules of Court establishes the categories of members of the Civil and Small Claims Advisory Committee. The current categories are appellate court justice, trial court judicial officer, judicial administrator, lawyer whose primary area of practice is civil law, legal secretary, and person knowledgeable about small claims law and procedure. This proposal would add a new membership category for persons knowledgeable about court-connected alternative dispute resolution (ADR) programs for civil and small claims cases.

The Civil and Small Claims Advisory Committee has an active ADR Subcommittee, which makes recommendations to the advisory committee concerning rules, forms, and policies relating to court ADR programs for civil and small claims cases. The committee's current membership categories, however, do not expressly include individuals with specific expertise in ADR programs. While the committee has been fortunate to have among its members many judges, court administrators, and attorneys who have experience in the ADR area, most individuals apply for and are appointed to the advisory committee based on their interest and expertise in civil litigation or small claims litigation. The committee has rarely had candidates or members whose main area of expertise was court-connected ADR programs. As a result, the ADR Subcommittee has often needed to create working groups with nonmembers, including court administrators, practitioners, and academics who specialize in ADR, in order to develop sound recommendations for the full advisory committee's consideration. A new membership category would allow the advisory committee to recruit as members individuals who have significant interest and expertise in court-connected ADR programs. The advisory committee does not intend that the new membership category increase the total number of committee members, but rather be offset by a reduction in the number of members appointed from one or more of the other membership categories.
