4 Choices to Finish Your Case: A Response has been Filed

If you are in full agreement:

- Prepare the Judgment and other necessary documents yourselves. See the Court's Judgment Checklist (local form FM-1052 (Divorce/Legal Separation) or FM-1053 (Parentage)) to see what forms you need to finish your case.
- 2. Hire an attorney to prepare the Judgment documents for you.
- 3. The Court's Self-Help Center can help you finalize your case. Set up a Case Status Conference by calling the Clerk's Office (408-882-2900). At the Status Conference the court attorney working with you will review your file and make an appointment to finish your case. Both parties must come to the appointment in person.

Important: The Self-Help Center does <u>not</u> write up agreements to divide things you own or debts you owe. Please see a private attorney for help.

If you disagree or the other party isn't cooperating to make an appointment:

- 4. File a Request for Trial (local form FM-1012) to finish your case
 - See the attached *Alternative Dispute Resolution Options* (local form FM-1021) information about how to resolve issues yourselves before going to trial.
