Riverside County Self Represented Litigant Task Force Priority – Making information easily accessible by & to the public through **PUBLIC LEGAL INFORMATION FORUMS.**

<u>PURPOSE</u>: Help improve understanding of the legal system, roles of attorneys and the courts in providing access to justice; educate about rights and obligations in various areas of the law; publicize the Court's Self-Help Centers, legal assistance coordinators and providers; increase awareness of the County Law Library.

COLLABORATION:

<u>Superior Court –</u> providing a judge (generally from the Self Represented Litigants Task Force) to welcome participants, answer questions about the Court and its assistance services;

Law Library – providing space for the Forums in the Library after closing (7:00 PM), displaying resources on the topics, preparing handouts and publicity, gathering statistics and survey information from attendees

Bar Association – providing specialists in particular areas of law and materials regarding their low cost assistance programs for the public, contributing funds to the Law Library for advertising costs and/or refreshments.

<u>Charter Communications</u> – videotape a second, private presentation in the Courthouse for viewing on public television

<u>ADVERTISING</u>: A display ad and article in local newspapers precede every Forum; other advertising includes Court and Library website announcements and flyers placed in community centers, government offices and other libraries

FORUMS held bimonthly; 1 and a half hour program includes Q & A period; program topics determined on basis of community surveys; attendance has varied from 12 to 40 depending on the topic; survey response has been overwhelmingly positive, increasing goodwill, knowledge of local resources and better prepared litigants. This project won the **Best Public Relations Program of 2007** from the American Association of Law Libraries.
