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# **Executive Summary**

The Family and Juvenile Law Advisory Committee recommends that the Judicial Council approve the allocation of funding for the Child Support Commissioner and Family Law Facilitator Program for fiscal year 2011–2012. The Judicial Council is required to annually allocate non–trial court funding to local courts for this program (Assem. Bill 1058; Stats. 1996, ch. 957). The funds are provided through a cooperative agreement between the California Department of Child Support Services (DCSS) and the Judicial Council.

#### Recommendation

The Family and Juvenile Law Advisory Committee recommends that the Judicial Council, effective retroactively to July 1, 2011:

1. Approve the allocation for funding of child support commissioners for fiscal year 2011–2012, subject to the state Budget Act (see Attachment A); and

2. Approve the allocation for funding of family law facilitators for fiscal year 2011–2012, subject to the state Budget Act (see Attachment B).

#### **Previous Council Action**

The Judicial Council is required to annually allocate non-trial court funding to the child support commissioner and family law facilitator program and has done so since 1997. A cooperative agreement between the California Department of Child Support Services (DCSS) and the Judicial Council provides the funds for this program and requires the Council to annually approve the funding allocation.

#### **Rationale for Recommendation**

In 1997, the Judicial Council established staffing standards for child support commissioners under Family Code section 4252(b)(3). Staffing standards are based on the number of local child support agency cases that have established child support orders. In addition, under an established procedure described in the standard agreement with each superior court, questionnaires are sent annually to each court requesting the information needed to evaluate appropriate funding levels for any exceptional needs.

Two-thirds of the base allocation funding comes from the federal government, with the remaining one-third coming from the state General Fund (non-trial court funding). In addition to the base allocation funding, there is a federal drawdown option developed in fiscal year 2007–2008 by DCSS and the AOC as a process by which the courts could maintain existing levels of program services and recover two-thirds of local trial court funds expended for and contributed to the program to cover additional program costs beyond the current contract maximum. This process allows the courts to use such contributions in lieu of the one-third state General Fund match to draw down the two-thirds federal coverage of allowable and approved program costs to the extent that funds are available. This federal drawdown option will continue to be available for fiscal year 2011–2012. Program funding is implemented via separate interagency agreements between DCSS and the AOC for the child support commissioners and the family law facilitators.

DCSS has advised the AOC that the funding available for the base allocations for fiscal year 2011–2012 will remain at the same level as that of the preceding fiscal year. Because statewide funding is level with the prior fiscal year, only special requests that were necessary for the courts to continue their mandated duties were considered. One court has agreed to reduce their grant by returning all funds under the federal drawdown procedure for both the child support commissioner and family law facilitator program components, making these funds available for allocation to other participating courts. An upward adjustment was made for one court on the commissioner side of the program so that the court can return to utilizing its full authorized child

support commissioner position that it had previously voluntarily reduced. Another upward adjustment was made for one court on the family law facilitator side for the billing of allowable indirect costs that had not been previously budgeted or billed. Under the established allocation procedures for this program, the request was reviewed by a workgroup consisting of local court staff and by the Family and Juvenile Law Advisory Committee. Both of these groups unanimously recommended the proposed allocations.

Funding for fiscal year 2011–2012 for the child support commissioner component of the program will be \$32.4 million base allocation and \$12.2 million in federal drawdown option; funding for the family law facilitator component will be \$11.1 million base allocation and \$4.1 million in federal drawdown option, for a total program base allocation of \$43.5 million and a total program federal drawdown allocation of \$16.3 million.

In addition to their allocation of the base funding, courts may choose to participate in the federal drawdown option.

## **Comments, Alternatives Considered, and Policy Implications**

This proposal was not circulated for public comment because the existing advisory committee and workgroup approval process for program funding provides sufficient input from all relevant stakeholders. No alternative action was considered, as the Judicial Council is required to allocate funding for this legislatively mandated program.

# Implementation Requirements, Costs, and Operational Impacts

Federal provisions require that any request to draw down federal funds requires payment of a state share of one-third of total expenditures. Therefore each participating court needs to provide the one-third share of its total cost to draw down two-thirds of total expenditures through federal participation.
