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California State Courts Close Wednesday, June 16

Closures Result of Unprecedented State Budget Cuts

San Francisco—All California state courts will close on Wednesday, June 16, 2010, as a cost-saving measure to help courts cope with unprecedented budget reductions in the judicial branch of government.

Statewide court closures may be averted during fiscal year 2010–2011. A budget agreement approved last month in both the Senate and Assembly budget committees and supported by stakeholder groups would allow state courts to remain open.

Statewide court closures may be averted during fiscal year 2010–2011, due to a revised state budget announced in January by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger. The Judicial Council has advocated for sufficient funding to keep courts open after June 2010.

The courts to close tomorrow are the Supreme Court of California, the Courts of Appeal, and the superior courts in each of California's 58 counties. The Administrative Office of the Courts also will be closed.

At an emergency public meeting in July 2009, the Judicial Council approved the court closures on the third Wednesday of each month starting in September 2009 and continuing through this month. The closures were authorized by Government Code section 68106, passed by the Legislature and signed by the Governor.

At a special meeting in January 2010, the council voted to continue the court closures through June 2010, because of the severity of the state's economic crisis and the judicial branch budget reductions.
