Fourth Appellate District Announces Destruction of Old Court Records

San Diego—The Court of Appeal, Fourth Appellate District, Division One (San Diego), has announced its intention to destroy the following criminal, juvenile, and civil records pursuant to Rule 10.1028(c), California Rules of Court:

These cases encompass criminal cases preserved for a period longer than 20 years and civil cases preserved for a period longer than 10 years.
