Fourth Appellate District Announces Destruction of Old Court Records

San Diego—The Court of Appeal, Fourth Appellate District, has announced its intention to destroy some of its criminal, juvenile, and civil records under Rule 10.1028(c) of the California Rules of Court.

DIVISION ONE

The Fourth Appellate District, Division One (San Diego), would destroy the following records:

- 4CR11831 *People vs. Salazar*
- 4CR11822 *People vs. Fierro*
- D001428 *People vs. Marsh*
- 4CIV18915 *McDougal vs. Superior Court*
- 4CIV18766 *County of Imperial vs. McDougal*

These cases encompass criminal cases preserved for a period longer than 20 years and civil cases preserved for a period longer than 10 years.

DIVISION TWO

The Fourth Appellate District, Division Two (Riverside), would destroy the following records:

- All criminal and juvenile cases designated in records transfer lists 12312005 and 12312006 encompassing criminal and juvenile records preserved for a period longer than 20 years.
- All civil cases designated in records transfer lists 12312005 and 12312006 encompassing civil records preserved for a period longer than 10 years.
