AOC, Sacramento Superior Court Reach Agreement on Case Management System

San Francisco – The Judicial Council, acting through the Administrative Office of the Courts, and the Superior Court of Sacramento County have reached an agreement to improve the performance of the California Court Case Management System (CCMS) in Sacramento. Sacramento is one of six pilot courts operating CCMS.

Under the terms of the agreement, the Judicial Council/AOC will take steps to achieve real-time (every 30 seconds) streaming of the Superior Court's data to the technology center and to the local data center's CCMS database.

"This agreement provides for the continued improvement in the California Court Case Management System and will allow the court to benefit from the common use of the statewide technology center," said Ronald G. Overholt, Chief Deputy Director of the AOC. "The excellent collaboration between the Sacramento Superior Court and the AOC will benefit court technology efforts going forward."

"I am pleased with the agreement," said Sacramento Presiding Judge Steve White. "These changes are being implemented within 60 court-days. They will dramatically improve Sacramento's CCMS performance. It will allow us to achieve the speed and efficiencies necessary to our court. This will be a major step towards realizing the benefits of a statewide system while accommodating the unique needs and circumstances of local courts."

The California Courts Case Management System is a statewide initiative to develop and deploy a unified case management system for all 58 superior courts.
