OPEN MEETING

Call to Order and Roll Call

The chair called the meeting to order at 11:08 a.m. and took roll call.

Approval of Minutes

The advisory body reviewed and approved the minutes of the May 20, 2016 Trial Court Facility Modification Advisory Committee meeting. (*Motion: Tucker; Second: Highberger*)

PUBLIC WRITTEN COMMENT

No public comments were received.

ACTION ITEMS (ITEMS 1-10)

Action Item 1 – (Action Required) – List A – Emergency Facility Modification Funding (Priority 1)

Summary: Ratify emergency facility modifications from List A.

Action: Reviewed and ratified 35 projects for a total of \$584,079 to be paid from funds previously encumbered for emergency funding. (Motion: Romero Soles; Second: Vallarta)

Action Item 2 – (Action Required) – List B – Facility Modifications Less than \$50K (Priority 2)

Summary: Ratify facility modifications less than \$50K from List B.

Action: Reviewed and ratified 152 projects for a total of \$1,373,054 to be paid from funds previously encumbered for facility modifications less than \$50K. (Motion: Vallarta; Second: Tucker)

Action Item 3 - (Action Required) - List C - Cost Increases Over \$50K

Summary: Ratify facility modifications requiring cost increases over \$50K from List C.

Action: Reviewed and approved three projects for a total cost increase to the Facility Modification Program Budget of \$485,282. (Motion: Highberger; Second: Romero Soles)

Action Item 4 – (Action Required) – List D – Facility Modifications Over \$50K

Summary: Review recommended facility modifications over \$50K projects from List D.

Action: Reviewed and approved 15 projects recommended for funding for a total cost to the Facility Modification Program Budget of \$2,531,713. Items #3 (FM-0058865) and #12 (FM-0017562) were approved pending shared cost approval from the relevant county partners. (Motion: Romero Soles; Second: Tucker)

Action Item 5 – (Action Required) – Sustainability: Energy Efficiency Projects

Summary: Review recommended energy efficiency facility modifications from List D.

Action: Reviewed and approved one energy efficiency project from List D – item #16 – for a total cost to the Facility Modification Program Budget of \$43,282. There is an expected ROI of 4.5 years payback. (Motion: Vallarta; Second: Romero Soles)

Action Item 6 – (Action Required) – Quarterly Activity Report, Quarter 4 of Fiscal Year 2015–2016

Summary: Review and discuss the *Trial Court Facility Modification Advisory Committee Activity Report* for Quarter 4, Fiscal Year 2015-2016.

Action: The committee reviewed and approved the draft report with committee edits to move forward to E&P. (Motion: Highberger; Second: Stoelker)

Action Item 7 – (Action Required) – Proposed Revision to *Court-Funded Facilities*Request Policy

Summary: Review and discuss the draft *Court-Funded Facilities Request Policy*.

Action: The committee reviewed the policy revisions, including the removal of fiscal review, and suggested edits on the submittal receipt and appeals language. Action was deferred to a later meeting date (July 29, 2016). (Motion: Vallarta; Second: Rockwell)

Action Item 8 – (Action Required) – FY 17-18 Deferred Maintenance

Summary: Review and discuss deferred maintenance items, including the draft FY 17-18 Deferred Maintenance Report that is submitted to Department of Finance (DOF) annually, showing the complete list of deferred facilities maintenance, and the list of Deferred Maintenance projects ready for execution from the Governor's \$45M allocation. These total 39 projects and \$12,077,308 of the branch's share.

Action: The committee reviewed the report and expressed concern over the missing delta of projects between the \$45M project list and the full backlog. Action on the report was deferred to a later meeting date (July 29, 2016). (Motion: Highberger; Second: Vallarta)

Action Item 9 - (Action Required) - FY 16-17 Budget Allocations

Summary: Review and discuss finalized FY 16-17 FM budget allocations. The proposed budget was previously presented at the May 20, 2016 meeting.

Action: The committee confirmed that there were no changes to the allocations discussed at the May 20th meeting and approved the budget allocations. (Motion: Highberger; Second: Tucker)

Action Item 10 - (Action Required) - FM Approval Authority Threshold

Summary: Discussion of increase to approval authority threshold for facilities staff.

Action: The committee discussed the approval increase from \$50K to \$100K and asked staff to clarify the classifications that will have this authority. The Facilities Management Administrators will have project approval authority up to \$25,000; Facilities Operations Supervisors (sometimes referred to as "Regional Supervisors" will have project approval authority up to \$100,000. These projects will show up on List B in future meetings, and the committee will now only review projects for approval greater than \$100,000 total on List D. This authority does not apply to cost increases. The committee also requested that the Trial Court Methodology for Prioritizing and Ranking Facility Modifications document also be updated to reflect this change. (Motion: Romero Soles; Second: Highberger; the record notes that Judge Vallarta voted "No" on this motion)

Summary: Reviewed List F – Funded Facility Modifications on Hold. As of this meeting, there are 32 projects on hold with a total Facility Modification Program Budget Share of \$13,155,009. Summarized below is the FY 2016-17 Court Facilities Trust Fund (CFTF) budget allocation.

Beginning Budget Authority

The CFTF budget authority for FY 2016-17 is \$121,083,000, including reimbursements of \$9,000,000.

Revenues/Transfers

The CFTF receives revenue from various sources, including County Facility Payments (CFPs), rental revenue, General Fund transfers, night court fees, Surplus Money Investment Fund (SMIF) interest, and miscellaneous revenue. Total resources in the fund fully support the authorized expenditure level.

1. County Facility Payments (CFPs)

Counties make County Facility Payments in perpetuity to the Judicial Council (JCC) to provide funding for ongoing operations and maintenance of transferred court facilities. The CFP is based on historical costs counties spent for operating and maintaining the court facility. The CFP revenue projection includes CFP adjustments and CFPs initiating mid-year for newly constructed or renovated court facilities.

2. Rental Revenue

The CFTF receives rental revenue from various sources including parking, leases and licenses between the JCC and third party occupants, food service providers, rooftop agreements for cell sites, and miscellaneous services such as ATMs.

3. General Fund Transfers

The CFTF receives an ongoing General Fund augmentation in the amount of \$8,053,000 as General Fund transfers in support of the New Judgeships, costs for new courthouses and

inflation. General Fund transfers in support of new courthouses and inflationary adjustments have remained the same since FY 2009-10.

4. Night Court Fees

Pursuant to SB 1732 and Vehicle Code Section 42006, transferred facilities holding night court collect assessments and transmit them to the CFTF. Revenue from night court fees has been declining since FY 2013-14 and the downward trend continued into FY 2015-16. Based on an average reduction of 11.29% of fiscal years 2013-14 and 2014-15, the FY 2016-17 projection reflects a reduction from FY 2015-16 night court revenue.

5. Surplus Money Investment Fund (SMIF) Interest

The CFTF earns interest on funds invested in the SMIF. FY 2015-16 rates saw an increase over FY 2014-15 averaging 0.17%. Until there is FY 2016-17 data that indicates the trend of increased rates is continuing, resulting in increased SMIF revenue, the revenue projected for FY 2016-17 is being held flat from FY 2015-16.

6. Miscellaneous Revenue

The CFTF receives miscellaneous revenue, such as penalties for late payments to the CFTF. Revenue received in this category is unstable and can vary from year to year.

Budget Allocation

The CFTF budget is allocated to routine maintenance, utilities, rent, and insurance for JCC managed and county managed trial court facilities. A portion of routine maintenance is also allocated to delegated court maintenance. In addition to the allocations below, other actions planned for FY 2016-17 include:

- The use of approximately \$100,000 in unspent cash from FY 2015-16 for security equipment maintenance.
- The reserve of \$2,059,000 of fund balance for a previously agreed upon transfer of funds for the Santa Clara debt service. This transfer will occur in FY 2017-18 based on the Intra-Branch Agreement (IBA) between Santa Clara Superior Court and the JCC.

1. Judicial Council Managed Expenditures

JCC managed expenditures are facilities operations costs incurred by the JCC in JCC managed, trial court facilities. These include facilities that are 100% court occupied, shared facilities where counties are billed their share of common costs in JCC managed trial court facilities (reimbursement), and new judgeships facilities. A total of \$76,561,000, including \$6,420,000 reimbursements has been allocated to JCC managed expenditures. The allocation includes estimated costs for new courthouses scheduled to complete and take occupancy in FY 2016-17. The allocation of JCC managed expenditures is described below.

Routine maintenance allocations are based on the service provider annual contract values as of July 1, 2016, including 7% Performance Based Compensation (PBC) and miscellaneous expenditures such as permits, phones and trash removal. Of the total \$42,242,000 routine maintenance allocation, \$39,074,000 (including reimbursements) is allocated to the three service provider contracts. The service provider allocation includes a contractual cost increase and a 3% escalation of the base firm fixed contract value for cost plus work. The remaining routine maintenance budget is for miscellaneous expenditures. The utility allocation is based on FY 2015-16 actual expenditures, escalated based on the average year over year change in utility rates and adjusted for known factors, such as estimated costs for new courthouses taking occupancy in FY 2016-17. If actual utilities costs come in under the projected allocation, savings will be redirected for use on other needs. Rent allocations are based on costs estimated by the Real Estate and Facilities Management, Real Estate unit and include rent, and taxes and assessments

for current and projected leases and licenses. The FY 2016-17 budget of \$1,000,000 for insurance remains unchanged from last fiscal year and is projected to be sufficient to support risk management needs for insurance, claims and settlements.

The reimbursement allocation for FY 2016-17 is \$6,420,000. Annually, the JCC provides statements of estimated shared costs to counties in JCC managed shared use facilities. Counties make quarterly estimate payments based on approved estimates that are then trued up to actual expenditures. The routine maintenance allocation includes the counties' share of the service provider annual contract value, miscellaneous expenditures, and county shared costs for facilities where routine maintenance services have been delegated to a court. The utility reimbursement allocation is based on prior year actual expenditures and trends.

2. Court Delegated Expenditures

The Judicial Council has entered into Intra-Branch agreements (IBAs) with four superior courts; Imperial, Orange, Riverside and San Luis Obispo, delegating facilities maintenance. The FY 2016-17 delegated facilities maintenance budget of \$3,707,000 results from the delegated contract value for the four delegated superior courts, based on a cost per square foot allocation of \$2.11 for Judicial Council managed facilities, and \$0.53 in county managed buildings.

3. County Managed Expenditures

The JCC is billed by counties for its share of common area operational costs incurred by counties in county managed, shared trial court facilities. A total of \$47,795,000, including routine maintenance, utilities, rent, and insurance has been allocated for county managed expenditures. Annually, counties (managing party) provide statements of estimated shared costs in county managed shared facilities. The JCC makes quarterly estimate payments on the first day of the quarter based on approved estimate statements that are then trued up to actual expenditures. The allocations for FY 2016-17 are based on FY 2015-16 expenditures, escalated based on the average year over year change in the inflation index and utility rates, adjusted for known factors. Los Angeles County is the managing party for utilities in the shared trial court facilities. Los Angeles County holds a Cogen agreement with Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) for its Civic Center Cogeneration Plant. The plant produces process steam used to provide heating and cooling to a variety of buildings in downtown Los Angeles, including some trial court facilities. The Cogen Plant produces electricity as a buy-product of process steam that is delivered to the LADWP electric system, who in turn provides payment to Los Angeles County for that electricity. The electricity revenue helps offset utility expenditures. The previous Cogen agreement between LADWP and Los Angeles County expired December 15, 2015 and the County began receiving less in payment for the electricity produced. This resulted in a large decrease in the Cogen revenue that has historically reduced utilities costs charged to the JCC. Los Angeles County entered into new agreements that include reduced operating costs that will help mitigate the decrease in Cogen revenue. Los Angeles County is estimating the impact of the new agreements to the JCC's share of utilities costs in FY 2016-17 is an increase of \$1.7 million. The rent allocation is based on estimated costs from the Real Estate unit for rent and taxes and assessments.

Proposed FY 2016-17 Budget Revision (BR)

Our current authority is not sufficient to support the FY 2016-17 expenditure plan; however, the CFTF projected FY 2015-16 fund balance has sufficient reserves to support a \$9,561,000 budget year augmentation to increase authority to meet the expenditure needs for FY 2016-17 and assist in meeting the expenditure plan shown above.

The current funding plan includes estimated savings of \$2,435,000 from FY 2013-14 unspent funds. If the final FY 2015-16 fund balance is insufficient to support the current expenditure plan, the service provider contracts will be reduced to offset any shortfall.

Table 2 below summarizes the proposed change to the initial budget allocation.

Summary

The FY 2016-17 CFTF budget authority of \$121,083,000 provides support of CFTF payables, which includes \$112,083,000 judicial branch facility program expenditures and \$9,000,000 reimbursement authority. A budget year augmentation request of \$9,561,000 will bring our expenditure authority to \$121,644,000, excluding reimbursements, and support the FY 2016-17 CFTF expenditure plan. Until the augmentation request is approved \$9,561,000 of the trial court facilities operations routine maintenance budget will be withheld. Upon approval of the augmentation, the budget will be adjusted to reflect the additional authority.
