



OPEN MEETING

Call to Order, Roll Call and Opening Remarks

Update on SB 1407 Financial Status

OPEN MEETING

Call to Order and Roll Call

The chair called the meeting to order at 12:15 PM.

DISCUSSION AND ACTION ITEMS

Item 1

Existing San Diego County Courthouse: Disposition and Demolition

Hon. Brad R. Hill, chair, introduced Hon. Steven E. Jahr (Ret.) as a new member to the advisory committee, thanking him for his participation.

Mr. Curtis Child provided an overview of the proposal explaining that as part of the San Diego property transaction, the Judicial Council became the owner of the old courthouse and jail and the land on which these buildings sit. He stated that the Judicial Council has the responsibility to demolish the old courthouse and jail currently occupied by the Superior Court of San Diego County, after the new courthouse is completed in December 2016. He indicated that Judicial Council staff will be preparing a Request for Proposal (RFP) in the near future to solicit offers for the land, which requires legislation for their disposition.

Mr. Charles Martel indicated that the future disposal of the San Diego property was contemplated, as documented in the 2009 funding request for the project, to offset some of the costs of new courthouse. He explained that the proposed legislation is needed to allow the Judicial Council the authority to dispose of the San Diego property, because it is still in use and therefore does not qualify as surplus property. He indicated that the proposed legislation was developed with input from the State Department of Finance. He noted that included in the future RFP and in exchange for the San Diego property, the buyer would be asked to take on the following obligations for the Judicial Council: demolition of the existing courthouse including two bridges, repairs to the façade of the adjacent buildings where the bridges were removed, replacement of the chilled-water system running through the existing courthouse supplying other county buildings, and—if possible—construction of a prisoner transport tunnel to the new courthouse.

Ms. Kelly Quinn indicated that with the advisory committee's vote, the recommendation would move to the Judicial Council's Policy Coordination and Liaison Committee for consideration at its meeting on April 30, 2015.

Action: The advisory committee—with the exception of Hon. David Edwin Power as an Ex-Officio, non-voting member and of the members who were absent as shown above—voted unanimously on the following motion:

1. The Court Facilities Advisory Committee recommends that the Judicial Council sponsor legislation authorizing the Judicial Council to dispose of the San Diego Property at its fair market value in exchange for cash to pay for, or the in-kind performance of, certain Judicial

Council obligations to the County of San Diego undertaken as a result of the Judicial Council's acquisition of the San Diego Property and the property on which the New Courthouse is being constructed, and, if possible, construction of an underground inmate transportation tunnel between the New Courthouse and the County central jail on Front Street, or some combination thereof, with any excess proceeds applied to rental or debt service payments owed with respect to the bond financing for the New Courthouse.



Draft Water Conservation Policy for California Judicial Branch Capital Projects May 6, 2015

Capital projects may include practices that conserve water during the construction process and on an ongoing operational basis. These practices fall into two categories, including:

- A. Practices for Capital Projects; and
- B. Enhanced Practices Requiring Further Analysis

These two categories are further defined below.

A. Practices for Capital Projects

The water conservation practices listed below may be implemented immediately on all capital projects in the preliminary plans phase or earlier. For projects in later stages, the project teams will review these practices and implement where feasible.

- 1. Water Conservation During Construction
 - a. Capital projects required to remove groundwater (dewater) during construction excavation may make best efforts to recycle or reuse the groundwater collected, if feasible.
 - b. Non-potable water will be used for dust control activities, if feasible.
- 2. Plumbing Fixtures
 - a. Capital projects will install plumbing fixtures that meet or, if possible, exceed the April 2014 California Energy Commission (CEC) or California Green Code standards, whichever is most stringent.
- 3. Landscaping
 - a. Landscaping design that does not include turf/grass will be considered.
 - b. Landscaped areas will include indigenous and climate appropriate, drought-tolerant plants and trees.
 - c. Site design will encourage permeability on the portions of the site not covered by buildings or vehicle bearing pavement.
- 4. Irrigation Systems
 - a. Irrigation systems will target systems using drip and micro-sprayers only.
 - b. Irrigation systems will include an automated, "smart" controller.
 - c. Irrigation systems will include a water meter, or submeter, separate from building supply.
- 5. On-Site Water Management
 - a. On-site storm water management practices, where feasible given site limitations, will include water retention basins or other practices to recharge groundwater through natural percolation.

B. Enhanced Practices Requiring Further Analysis

These practices could apply to all capital projects but will be studied on a project-by-project basis to determine cost and feasibility on a life-cycle basis¹.

- 1. On-Site Water Management
 - a. Capital projects will evaluate on-site systems that re-use 100% of all gray water generated by the courthouse facility.
 - b. Capital projects will evaluate the use of non-potable water for irrigation, toilet/urinal flushing, and HVAC system (if applicable to selected HVAC system). Sources may include on-site sources, such as gray water, rain water retention, and displacement from mechanical cooling systems, or off-site sources, such as recycled water provided by the local water agency.
- 2. Permeable paving and permeable hardscape materials will be considered for pedestrian and vehicle areas.
- 3. Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC)
 - a. Design teams will consider mechanical cooling systems that are air chilled versus water chilled.
 - b. Design teams will consider system features that reduce or collect evaporation.
