What is a Facility Modification?

 Alteration, renovation, rehabilitation, replacement, or refurbishment of existing assets

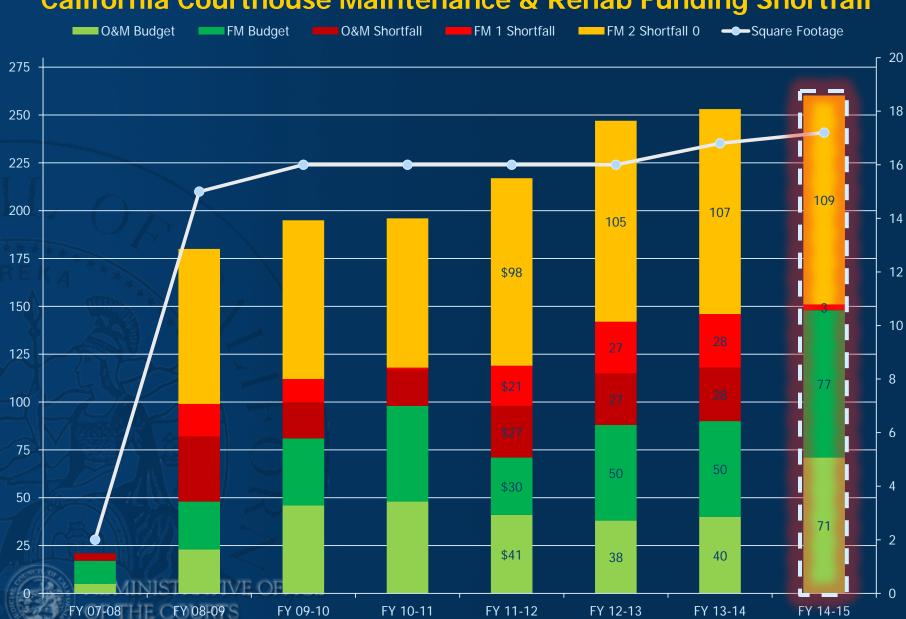
- Distinct from routine maintenance and repair activities
- Excludes facility expansion



Key Concerns

- Not enough money for Facility Modifications or Routine Maintenance
- Increasing cost to service new, larger buildings on line for completion
- Need to maintain buildings taken off SB1407 replacement list





California Courthouse Maintenance & Rehab Funding Shortfall

FY 2013-14 FM Approved Total Approved Budget - \$50M

	Approved Allocation	Percentage
Statewide Planning	\$4,000,000	8%
Priority 1 - Emergencies	\$7,000,000	14%
Planned Priority 2-6	\$-	-
Unplanned Priority 2-6	\$39,000,000	78%

Change From FY2012/13 Budget

- \$2 Million added for P1 Emergency
- \$2 Million reduced from P2 urgent projects just short of full emergency
- More systems will "run to failure" to qualify for P1 funding
- \$18 Million BCP for FY2013/14 rejected by DOF

Impact to Courts

- Impacts 16 different courts & 25 facilities
- Work is Priority 3 "Needed" projects
- Costs range between \$100k and \$2.9M
- Facility Condition continues to degrade.
