TORAN ON DISCIPLINE

Probation revoked

The court orders that the probation of ZACHARY ALEXANDER TORAN, State Bar Number 267822, is revoked. The court further orders that:

- 1. ZACHARY ALEXANDER TORAN is suspended from the practice of law for a minimum of three years, and he will remain suspended until he provides proof to the State Bar Court of his rehabilitation, fitness to practice and learning and ability in the general law. - 2. ZACHARY ALEXANDER TORAN is given credit towards the three years' suspension for the period of involuntary inactive enrollment which commenced on April 23, 2015.
