LOYDE)**

Opinion filed: Judgment reversed

We reverse the judgment of death, remand for retrial on the penalty phase and for resentencing on all counts. The judgment is affirmed in all other respects.

 - i. He makes restitution to Irenka Stojakovic in the amount of \$5,000 plus 10 percent interest per year from August 2, 2011 (or reimburses the Client Security Fund, to the extent of any payment from the fund to Irenka Stojakovic, in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6140.5) and furnishes satisfactory proof to the State Bar's Office of Probation in Los Angeles;
