Pursuant to your request, I am writing to identify the legal issues I wish to focus upon in the oral argument of this case on Wednesday, October 5, 2005, in Redding, California.

The focus issues are Argument I (“The Trial Court Excluded Substantive Evidence Indicating The Two Key Prosecution Witnesses Committed The Crimes And Also Refused To Permit Defense Impeachment With This Evidence Contrary To State Law And In Violation Of James Robinson’s State And Federal Constitutional Rights”), and Argument II (“The Trial Court’s Handling Of The Jury Voir Dire In Both Phases Of This Capital Case Violated California Law And Denied James Robinson His Constitutional Rights To Equal Protection Of The Law, Due Process Of Law, A Fair Trial Before An Impartial Jury And A Reliable Determination Of Guilt And Of The Penalty”). I have advised opposing counsel, Deputy Attorney General Annalee Brodie, that these will be the focus issues.
