On February 24, 2014, defendant John Jeremy Cheso got into a fight with his wife and injured her.

Defendant pleaded no contest to corporal injury to a spouse. (Pen. Code, § 273.5, subd. (a).) The trial court sentenced him to a stipulated two-year state prison term, imposed various fines and fees, and awarded 309 days of presentence credits (155 actual and 154 conduct).

Defendant appeals. He did not obtain a certificate of probable cause.

We appointed counsel to represent defendant on appeal. Counsel filed an opening brief that sets forth the facts of the case and requests this court to review the record and determine whether there are any arguable issues on appeal. (*People v. Wende* (1979) 25 Cal.3d 436.) Defendant was advised by counsel of the right to file a supplemental brief within 30 days of the date of filing of the opening brief. More than 30 days elapsed, and we received no communication from defendant. Having undertaken an examination of the entire record, we find no arguable error that would result in a disposition more favorable to defendant.

DISPOSITION

The judgment is affirmed.
