## Standardization and CCMS

One of the guiding principles behind CCMS is to standardize wherever it makes good business sense. Moving from more than 70 case management systems around the state to a single case management system is in itself a form of standardization. However, within CCMS are even more opportunities to standardize, which will reduce costs and also make us more efficient and effective.

Examples of areas where standardization will come into play include:

- Statewide violation, fee, and bail schedules and tables
- Forms and notices (excluding local forms)
- Data exchanges between court, county, and state systems
- Minute orders and text
- Register of Action
- Calendar and work queue formats
- System user roles and security levels

### **What does standardization mean to court operations?**

From the court perspective, standardization of these items may reduce court workloads because updates and system management can be maintained centrally. Standardization may result in some changes to local case processing practices and procedures. As courts prepare for their individual deployments, analysis of the current business processes will be conducted with the deployment team to determine the impacts to local court processing.

### **Who determines standardization plans?**

As part of the CCMS V4 development project, subject matter experts from Los Angeles, Orange, San Diego, Sacramento, and Ventura Counties; the small court consortium; and the AOC are working together to identify and recommend CCMS standardization strategies.

## **CCMS News in the Courts**

### **Criminal and Traffic**

Release 5.0 of V2 was installed in Fresno Production on June 16. This release included improvements in the court's highest-priority functional areas:

- Fiscal
- DMV
- Calendar reporting
- JBSIS
- Ad Hoc reporting

### **Civil, Small Claims, Probate and Mental Health**

A weeklong session was conducted in Burbank to review and finalize e-filing enhancement design specifications. Co-chaired by the CCMS Program Office and the

AOC Information Services Division, the session was well attended by representatives from the CCMS lead courts.

## V4 Deployment RFP Update

On May 27 the two bidders, Deloitte Consulting and SAIC, each presented a three-hour overview of their proposed solutions to the CCMS Oversight Committee and members of the AOC and lead court evaluation teams. The evaluation teams then met on June 16 for the first consolidated view of the evaluation scoring. Vendor clarification sessions are slated to begin in mid-July. The goal is to select a preferred deployment vendor by late summer.
