### **Budget and Program Priorities for FY 2014-15**

The constant threat of further budget reductions and restraints hinders the Del Norte Superior Court from expanding services and opportunities to the community we serve. We remain dedicated to our employees, our community, and to providing access as best we can under these circumstances.

#### Self-Help / Mediation / Facilitator Services

Expansions to services are unfunded and impossible. Due to lack of adequate funding, Del Norte works with:

- limited hours
- reduced staff
- · only basic services

# Staff Impacts / Furloughs / Layoffs / Unfilled Vacancies

Court has held several positions vacant due to budget reductions, with salary savings redirected toward operating expenses. This reduces services and access to the public on an ongoing basis.

We anticipate additional staff vacancies due to retirements, which also will go unfilled to achieve salary savings at the expense of access.
