Budget and Program Priorities for FY 2014-15

Sufficient funding for a fully functioning court & state funding to cover rising costs. The Court is pursuing automation improvements, additional operating efficiencies, and redeployment of existing resources to reduce backlogs and delays in the absence of adequate funding.

Reductions in Judicial Officer Positions

- 9 Commissioner positions
- 28 Juvenile Referee positions

Closed Courtrooms and Court Houses

- 2012: eliminated court staff from 56 courtrooms
- 2013: closed 8 courthouses, 23 courtrooms

Staff Impacts / Furloughs / Layoffs / Unfilled Vacancies

- Budgeted staff positions reduced by 23% since FY 2008-09
- Furloughs were required to balance the budget in FY 2009-10

Court Reporters / Interpreter Services

- Part-time reporter program created in 2012 was ended in 2013; no court-employed reporters are provided in the civil courts
- There has been no decrease in provision of Interpreter services

Self-Help / Mediation / Facilitator Services

Court-supported ADR eliminated in 2013

Counters / Clerks / Telephones

- No reduction in clerk's office hours
- Telephone services are restricted

Court Security / Safety / Facilities

Inadequate funding of statewide realignment threatens the adequacy of courthouse security statewide

Budget Challenges for FY 2014-15

- Policy of 1% cap on fund balances limits the Court's ability to obtain vitally needed services and supplies, such as mission-critical technology
- State funding for the California trial courts remains significantly short of need
- Unlike other units of state government, the trial courts have not been funded for employee benefit cost increases or employee salary increases costs which must, instead, be funded by reductions in operations
