## **Budget and Program Priorities for FY 2014-15**

- Due to the closure of our Willits branch, litigants travel up to 70 miles to the Ukiah Courthouse
- Public access is extremely limited due to lack of funding for technology upgrades.
- Self-Help Center is only open to the public 3 hours a day, 4 days a week.

#### Self-Help / Mediation / Facilitator Services

- · Combined the Self-Help Center with the Facilitator's Office
- Mediation services for newly filed cases are limited to one session per family per Family Law court filing
- · There is one mediator for all of Mendocino County
- Family Court Custody and Visitation Evaluations no longer made available to the Family Court judge
- Self-Help hours reduced by one hour per day. Only open to the public 4 days a week.

#### **Court Reporters / Interpreter Services**

- Litigants must bring family members or friends to interpret at the Self-Help Center
- Laid off two full-time court reporters and left one part-time position vacant

#### Counters / Clerks / Telephones

Reduced telephone hours by 2 hours per day and counter hours by 1 hour per day

#### Closed Courtrooms (1) and Court Houses (1)

- Closed a single courtroom branch court in Willits on December 31, 2009 – a 33% reduction in Mendocino courthouses
- Calendar in Covelo and Point Arena changed from once per month to once every other month
- 2013 Thanksgiving and Christmas season hours were reduced

#### Staff Impacts / Furloughs / Layoffs / Unfilled Vacancies

- Instituted layoffs and reduced workforce with vacancy rate of 32%
- 26 mandatory furlough days for all employees in 2009
- 13 mandatory furlough days for all employees in 2010
- 5 mandatory furlough days for all employees in 2013

#### Court Security / Safety / Facilities

- Redirected 1 perimeter screening deputy
- Redirected 5 courtroom bailiffs
- Capital projects for priority 1 courthouse delayed

#### **Availability of Judicial Officers**

- Lay off part time Commissioner in Dec. 2009. Position not filled.
- Legal Secretary resigned in 2012. The position was not filled

- Reductions to court reporter services require litigants to provide their own court reporters
- There is one mediator for all of Mendocino County resulting in a substantial decrease in family law mediation
