Budget and Program Priorities for FY 2014-15

Identifying funds to continue Self-Help MOU with Superior Court of Santa Cruz County so that San Benito County residents can access self-help assistance in person in Hollister and Watsonville, and by phone and email, through the Santa Cruz Court's program. Due to ongoing reductions in allocation, we refrained from adding new programs or expanding existing programs in order to maintain existing level of public service.

Furloughs, Layoff & Voluntary Separations In calendar year 2013, the Court:

- Negotiated a furlough of 1 day per month for all staff that will be in effect at least until September 2014.
- Negotiated that all employees now pay 7% PERS.
- Laid off one position and accepted voluntary separation of three additional positions.

Impact of Furloughs, Layoff & Voluntary Separations

Due to savings achieved from furloughs, layoff and voluntary separations:

- All courtrooms remain open.
- Hours of public service remain at 8 hours per day.
- However, clerks in civil and criminal divisions are developing backlogs due to redistribution of workloads.

Impact of 1% Cap on Fund Balance

The 1% cap on fund balance eliminated the most effective managerial tool the Court had previously used to establish a history of fiscal stability.

New Courthouse Security Services

In March 2014, the Court will move from a courthouse of 11,000 square feet to a courthouse of 41,500 square feet:

- The allocation for security services for 41,500 square feet is the same as the allocation for 11,000 square feet.
- The annual shortfall in funding for security services is projected to be \$400,000.

Budget Challenges for FY 2014-15

- Current level of funding is insufficient to eliminate furloughs, rehire positions and enhance public service.
- Current level of funding is insufficient to offset new expenses related to new courthouse which may require reduction of programs such as self-help services.
