## **Budget and Program Priorities for FY 2014-15**

- Maintaining the existing level of public access remains a challenge for the Court.
- Addressing failing Case Management Systems that are preventing the court from expanding online access to the public.

#### Self-Help / Mediation / Facilitator Services

- Program staffing for the family law facilitator program has been cut.
- Due to staff reductions, reduction of nearly 15% in the number of people we are able to serve.

#### **Family Court Services**

- Family court parties have to wait approximately 2 months to have child custody issues heard by a family court counselor.
- Average family court services wait time is 8 weeks for first-time appointments, and 10 weeks for return visits.

#### **Court Reporters / Interpreter Services**

- Court reporters have been reduced by 38%.
- No longer provide court reporters in civil, probate and most family cases.

#### **Counters / Clerks / Telephones**

- Clerks' daily office hours shortened, and all offices close at noon on Fridays.
- Phone hours reduced at all court locations.

#### Closed Courtrooms (11) and Court Houses (1)

- Reduced small claims and traffic night court sessions
- Traffic trials are scheduled 6 7 months out, with some (e.g., red light camera challenges) at 10 months.
- Closed 7 of 22 Civil IC Courtrooms resulting in increased wait times from 4 to 10 months to have motions heard.
- Court users must travel up to 40 miles for probate and juvenile dependency matters because of closed facilities.

# **Budget Challenges for FY 2014-15**

- Reducing the lengthy delays between filing date and trial date for various case types, and the 8-month civil judgment and writ processing delays caused by high staff vacancy rates and courtroom closures.
- Implementing a new employee payroll system and benefits plan as a result of the County's recent decision to stop providing these services to the Court, and addressing the resulting increased costs for the Court.
