Court Sends Failure to Appear Hold Notification (DMV906)

Exchange Description

Trial courts use this California judicial branch XML schema-based data exchange to send a failure to appear hold abstract (DD5) to the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). The court must report a person's violation of the requirement to appear in court relating to a citation/charging document. This transaction is also used to report Owner Responsibility (equipment violations) for Failure to Appear (FTA) status.

- The notification message contains the FTA hold abstract information (e.g., participant's driver's license number and sections violated) sent by the court to the DMV.
- The response message is sent by the DMV upon successful receipt of the notification message and contains the FTA hold abstract response (e.g., participant's driver's license number and message code).

This data exchange may be used when a case participant is flagged for failure to appear as an outcome of the FTA enforcement process.

Business Response Exchanges

The business response refers to any subsequent exchanges that may occur as a direct result of this exchange.

- There is no business response to this exchange.

Error Handling

If the DMV does not successfully receive and process the request message, the trial court will receive an error message with an error code and error reason.

RELATED EXCHANGES

Related data exchanges are preceding or subsequent data exchanges that may be used by an integration partner as part of the overall business process related to this exchange.

- Court Sends Abstract of Conviction Notification (DMV902), which a court uses to report the initial conviction to DMV, after which the court will proceed with the FTA Hold Notification exchange.
- Court Sends Failure to Appear Release Notification (DMV903), which a court uses to release the FTA hold, and which may follow the FTA Hold Notification exchange.

Additional Information

- A single exchange message is sent for each DMV failure to appear hold notification request.
- The response to this exchange message only occurs after receipt and processing by the integration partner. Both the success and error response messages must be sent as separate messages using the formats defined in this exchange.
