### Court Receives Proposed Order After Hearing (OAH) (DSP816)

#### Exchange Description

Integration partners use this NIEM-based data exchange to send a proposed order to the trial court in preparation for ordering and issuing Order After Hearing (OAH) forms for the following case categories:

- Family Law (all cases)
- Juvenile Law (all cases)

Integration partners can use this data exchange to:

- Propose order(s) for a juvenile delinquency case hearing
- Propose paternity orders for a family law case
- Propose a child support order for a family law case
- Enforce a spousal support order for a family law case
- Propose an initial order for a juvenile dependency case hearing

The notification message from the integration partner contains the proposed order information (e.g., Minutes Order Capture System [MOCS] code and text, PDF version of the proposed order).

The response message contains delivery confirmation data with status information (e.g., “received”) and includes the contents of the notification message.

### PROBABLE INTERESTED INTEGRATION PARTNERS

- California Department of Child Support Services
- California Department of Social Services
- Electronic filing service providers
- Probation—adult and juvenile

### RELATED EXCHANGES

Related data exchanges are preceding or subsequent data exchanges that may be used by an integration partner as part of the overall business process related to this exchange.

- Court Sends Order After Hearing (DSP913), which contains the finalized Order After Hearing (OAH) forms and associated data (MOCS codes and text) sent by the court to the integration partner when a family law or juvenile proposed order is finalized and issued either inside or outside the courtroom.
- Court Sends Minute Order Notification (CRT901), which contains the finalized original or amended courtroom order notification sent by the court to the integration partner.

## Business Response Exchanges

The business response refers to any subsequent exchanges that may occur as a direct result of this exchange, as follows:

- Court Sends Proposed Order After Hearing (OAH) Confirmation Notification (DSP920) data exchange, which confirms that the proposed order after hearing request successfully passed the clerk review process and contains the pertinent information.
- Court Sends Clerk Review Rejection Notification (EFL902) data exchange, which contains rejection information in response to the court clerk's review of the initial filing. This message informs the originating integration partner the notification did not pass the court clerk review and corrective action is required.

## Error Handling

If the trial court does not successfully receive and process the incoming message, the integration partner receives an error message with an error code and error reason.

## Additional Information

- A single exchange message is sent for each proposed OAH request.
- This exchange is subject to the clerk review process, which requires that court personnel review the contents of the exchange before it is accepted and added to CCMS.
- The business response message is defined using a different exchange, listed above in the Business Response Exchanges section.
