Court Sends E-Service Notification (FN903)

Exchange Description

A trial court uses this California judicial branch XML schema-based data exchange to send case participants court notices and/or forms electronically. Usually, the case participant is a client of an electronic filing service provider (EFSP) and opts to receive notification electronically using their EFSP's web address. The EFSP receives the court notices/forms on behalf of their client and forwards them on to their client. Examples include the following:

- The trial court generates a Notice of Hearing for a case participant who has opted to receive notifications electronically using a web service address.
- The trial court generates a Notice of Case Re-assignment with form recipients that have a web service address.

The notification message contains an electronic copy of the notices/forms (e.g., Notice of Hearing, Clerk's Certification of Service by Mail, Clerk's Certification of Electronic Service).

No response message is sent by the integration partner upon successful receipt of the notification message. Successful delivery of the notification message is assumed unless an error in delivery or processing by the integration partner occurs.

Business Response Exchanges

The business response refers to any subsequent exchanges that may occur as a direct result of this exchange.

- There is no business response to this exchange.

Error Handling

If the integration partner does not successfully receive and process the incoming message, the trial court will receive an error message with an error code and error reason.

- Court Receives Case Initiation Filing— Family Law (Registration of Judgment of Order) (INI812).

Additional Information

- A single exchange message is sent for each e-service notification.
- The response to this exchange message only occurs after receipt and processing by the integration partner. The only allowable response to this exchange is an error message. The error response message must be sent as a separate message using the error format defined in this exchange.
