Court Receives Warrant Re-issuance/Purge Request (ISS803)

Exchange Description

A trial court uses this NIEM-based data exchange to receive a request from an integration partner to either reissue or purge a warrant. After the court reviews the re-issue or purge request, the judicial officer may approve or deny the request. When a reissue request is approved, the original warrant is recalled (if that warrant is still not cleared) and a new warrant is issued. When a purge request is approved, the original warrant is only recalled.

An integration partner may use this data exchange when:

- A warrant has expired.
- A warrant has been returned unserved.
- A warrant was inadvertently served against the wrong person.

The request message sent by the integration partner to the trial court contains warrant information (e.g., warrant ID and case number information).

The response message from the trial court contains delivery confirmation data with status information (e.g. "Received"), along with the contents of the original request message sent by the integration partner to the trial court.

PROBABLE INTERESTED INTEGRATION PARTNERS

- Law enforcement agency
- County sheriff

RELATED EXCHANGES

Related data exchanges are any preceding or subsequent data exchanges that may be used by an integration partner as part of the overall business process related to this exchange.

- Court Sends Warrant Issuance Recall Notification (ISS901), which is used by the trial court to send warrant issuances and recalls to an integration partner.
- Court Receives Warrant Status Update Notification (ISS802), which is used by the trial court to receive warrant status updates from an integration partner.
- Court Receives Warrant Proof of Service Notification (ISS804), which is used by the trial court to receive proof of warrant service from an integration partner.
- Court Receives Civil Issuances (Writs/Warrants) Query (ISS806), which is used by the trial court to receive information about civil writs and warrants from an integration partner.

Business Response Exchanges

The court clerk or judicial review process for this response is optional. The business response refers to any subsequent exchanges that may occur as a direct result of this exchange, as follows:

- Court Sends Warrant Re-issuance/Purge Request Confirmation Notification (ISS905), which confirms that the request passed court clerk or judicial review and that the warrant re-issuance or purge request has been approved.
- Court Sends Clerk Review Rejection Notification (EFL902), which contains rejection information in response to the court clerk's review of the initial filing.

Error Handling

If the trial court does not successfully receive and process the incoming message, the integration partner will receive an error message with an error code and error reason.

Additional Information

- A single exchange message is sent for each warrant re-issuance/purge request.
- The business response message is defined using a different exchange, listed above in the Business Response Exchanges section.
- The business response to this exchange occurs only after completion of the optional clerk review (CR) or judicial review process. When the exchange is implemented for CR, there will always be two responses: (1) the success response (or error response), and (2) the business response in this case ISS905 or ELF902 (clerk rejection).
- When CR is not implemented by the trial court, the response message, either success or error, to this exchange is sent immediately upon receipt and processing by CCMS. The integration partner will receive the business response (ISS905) only if they implement this exchange.
