

WHO IS A.R.C.?

A.R.C. is a non-profit organization committed to its mission of changing lives, and creating safe, healthy communities through a support network comprised of and for formerly incarcerated individuals and advocates. We provide the following services:

- MEMBER SUPPORT: ARC serves as a positive and encouraging community, so that members are
 empowered and recognize their ability as they transition back into society. We support
 members with counseling services, support groups, case management, and mentoring.
- HOUSING, JOBS & EDUCATION: In addition to reentry support, A.R.C. guides members in enrolling in education, preparing for and securing fulfilling employment, and provides supportive housing options.
- **INREACH:** A.R.C. staff and members regularly travel to prisons and detention facilities across California to provide rehabilitative programming, host policy workshops, and bring hope to incarcerated men and women.
- ADVOCACY: A.R.C. creates opportunities for formerly incarcerated individuals to share their
 experiences and recommendations for reform with policymakers to change California's justice
 system. Over the past few years, these efforts have led to numerous policy changes including SB
 9, SB 260, AB 1276, SB 382, and SB 261.
