Authorize Expenditures from Trial Court Improvement Fund (for Item 4 (A)–(E) refer to blue memo in Tab 4 concerning Special Fund Allocation availability) (Action Required)

9:40–9:50 a.m. (A) Authorize Expenditures from Trial Court Improvement Fund for Trial Court Labor Relations Assistance Program

AOC staff recommends that the Judicial Council approve suballocating from the Trial Court Improvement Fund (TCIF) an amount not to exceed \$940,000 for fiscal year 2001–2002 to fund the Trial Court Labor Relations Assistance Program, which AOC has developed to assist trial courts in paying part of the costs of service providers retained by the trial courts to negotiate labor agreements with unions representing trial court employees. The Trial Court Labor Relations Assistance Program will reimburse each trial court for 60 percent of the annual costs of such services, up to a maximum of \$25,000 for courts with an annual budget over \$10 million or \$10,000 for courts with an annual budget of \$10 million or less, rendered by AOC-approved labor relations service providers.

9:50–10:00 a.m. (B) Authorize Expenditures from Trial Court Improvement Fund for Statewide Trial Court Studies (Action Required)

AOC staff recommends that the Judicial Council approve:

- Allocating \$398,900 from the Trial Court Improvement Fund (TCIF) for fiscal year 2001–2002 to fund a statewide trial court *compensation* study. Providing a coordinated statewide focus, the purpose of the study is to establish consistency across the courts in classification plans and associated salary structures. The funding will enable the AOC to contract with an outside vendor with expertise in large-scale classification and compensation matters to design and implement a fair and equitable program.
- Allocating \$1,029,000 from the TCIF for fiscal year 2001—2002 to fund a statewide trial court *benefits* study. The purpose of the study is to create and implement a trial court employee benefits program to be in place prior to January 1, 2003, which is the date Senate Bill 2140 allows each county to exclude trial court employees from its benefits programs. The funding will enable the AOC to contract with an outside vendor with expertise in large-scale employee benefits programs to design and implement a program that is affordable and competitive.

The AOC's Office of the General Counsel would retain and manage the work of outside counsel who would be funded by this allocation to assist the courts in contracting for goods and services.

The site, which was released to the courts in June and will make its public debut July 17, has the potential to dramatically improve understanding of and access to the court by providing easy-to-understand descriptions of court procedures, step-by-step guides for choosing and completing necessary court forms, and links to legal services organizations and lawyer referral programs. Specifically, requested funds will be used for producing and distributing materials to the courts, libraries, social service offices, legal referral groups, and other public agencies, as well as for targeted media relations and advertising programs.
