MINUTES OF ACTION BY E-MAIL BETWEEN MEETINGS AUGUST 29, 2022

E-mail Proposal

Members received a time-sensitive proposal to request that the Legislation Committee consider submission of an official comment to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) on behalf of the Judicial Council and Court Security Advisory Committee, relating to personal security. The FTC publicized an Invitation to Comment: Commercial Surveillance and Data Security Rulemaking. Members considered a draft memo with limited comments specific to data brokers and the risks to judicial officers whose home addresses, phones, and emails are displayed—to bring awareness to the FTC discussion about whether new rules are needed to protect privacy and information.

Public Notice

Public notice was not posted advising that CSAC was proposing to act by e-mail between meetings under California Rules of Court, rule 10.75(o)(1)(B), due to staff oversight.

Public Comment

In accordance with California Rules of Court, rule 10.75(o)(2), written public comment was not accepted on the proposed action because prompt action was required.

Action Taken

Members were asked to submit their votes on the proposal. The e-mail proposal was approved. The draft was submitted to Governmental Affairs for editing and distribution to the Legislation Committee, which approved submission of the comment to the FTC. Copies were shared with staff to the Trial Court Presiding Judges Advisory Committee, Court Executives Advisory Committee, and Appellate Court Security Committee.
