Statutory citation: Budget Act of 2012, Provision 5 of Item 0250-001-0001

Date of report: October 4, 2012

The Judicial Council has submitted a report to the Legislature in accordance with the Budget Act of 2012, Item 0250-001-0001, Provision 5.

The following summary of the report is provided under the requirements of Government Code section 9795

The ongoing \$4.0 million reduction contained in the Budget Act of 2012 to state judiciary programs, including the Supreme Court, Courts of Appeal, Administrative Office of the Courts, Judicial Branch Facility Program, and Habeas Corpus Resource Center, will be achieved as follows:

- Reductions allocated to the Supreme Court and Courts of Appeal will be offset by new and increased appellate court filing fees and reductions to personal services;
- Reductions allocated to the Administrative Office of the Courts were achieved by layoffs reducing the workforce;
- Reductions allocated to the Judicial Branch Facility Program will be achieved through reductions in operating expenses;
- Reductions allocated to the Habeas Corpus Resource Center will be achieved through reductions in operating expenses and equipment and personal services.
