Summary of Cases Accepted and Related Actions During Week of June 25, 2018

[This news release is issued to inform the public and the press of cases that the Supreme Court has accepted and of their general subject matter. The statement of the issue or issues in each case set out below does not necessarily reflect the view of the court, or define the specific issues that will be addressed by the court.]

#18-86 McGlynn v. State of California, S248513. (A146855; 21 Cal.App.5th 548; San Francisco County Superior Court; CPF14514052.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed the judgment in an action for writ of administrative mandate. The court ordered briefing deferred pending decision in *Alameda County Deputy Sheriff's Assn. v. Alameda County Employees' Retirement Assn.*, S247095 (#18-49), which includes the following issue: Did statutory amendments to the County Employees' Retirement Law (Gov. Code, § 31450 et seq.) made by the Public Employees' Pension Reform Act of 2013 (Gov. Code, § 7522 et seq.) reduce the scope of the pre-existing definition of pensionable compensation and thereby impair employees' vested rights protected by the contracts clauses of the state and federal Constitutions?
