## **Summary of Cases Accepted and Related Actions During Week of October 8, 2018**

[This news release is issued to inform the public and the press of cases that the Supreme Court has accepted and of their general subject matter. The statement of the issue or issues in each case set out below does not necessarily reflect the view of the court, or define the specific issues that will be addressed by the court.]

#18-134 B.B. v. County of Los Angeles, \$250734. (B264946; 25 Cal.App.5th 115, mod. 25 Cal.App.5th 1006a; Los Angeles County Superior Court; TC027341, TC027438, BC505918.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed in part and reversed in part the judgment in a civil action. This case presents the following issue: May a defendant who commits an intentional tort invoke Civil Code section 1431.2, which limits a defendant's liability for non-economic damages "in direct proportion to that defendant's percentage of fault," to have his liability for damages reduced based on principles of comparative fault?

#18-135 People v. Frazier, S250300. (B281888; nonpublished opinion; Los Angeles County Superior Court; LA083934.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal modified and affirmed a judgment of conviction of criminal offenses. The court limited review to the following issue: Was the trial court's failure to instruct the jury that the special circumstance required the aider and abettor harbor the intent to kill prejudicial?

#18-136 People v. Lemcke, S250108. (G054241; nonpublished opinion; Orange County Superior Court; 14CF3596.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed judgments of conviction of criminal offenses. This case presents the following issue: Does instructing a jury with CALCRIM No. 315 that an eyewitness's level of certainty can be considered when evaluating the reliability of the identification violate a defendant's due process rights?

#18-137 People v. Brayton, S251122. (B284408; 25 Cal.App.5th 734; Ventura County Superior Court; 2016005604.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal reversed an order denying a petition to recall sentence. The court ordered briefing deferred pending decision in People v. Jimenez, S249397 (#18-99), which presents the following issue:

May a felony conviction for the unauthorized use of personal identifying information of another (Pen. Code, § 530.5, subd. (a)) be reclassified as a misdemeanor under Proposition 47 on the ground that the offense amounted to Penal Code section 459.5 shoplifting?

#18-138 People v. Jones, S250907. (F074518; nonpublished opinion; Stanislaus County Superior Court; 1497888.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed a judgment of conviction of a criminal offense. The court ordered briefing deferred pending decision in People v. Orozco, S249495 (#18-108), which presents the following issue: Can a felony conviction for receiving a stolen vehicle in violation of Penal Code section 496d be reclassified as a misdemeanor under Proposition 47in light of Penal Code section 496, subdivision (a), which provides that receiving other stolen property is a misdemeanor when the value of the property does not exceed \$950?

#18-139 People v. Smith, S250628. (E068320; nonpublished opinion; San Bernardino County Superior Court; 16CR070399.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed a judgment of conviction of a criminal offense. The court ordered briefing deferred pending decision in *In re Ricardo P.*, S230923 (#16-41) and *People v. Trujillo*, S244650 (#17-335), which present issues concerning the imposition of an "electronics search condition" of probation if the devices subject to the condition had no relationship to the crime or crimes committed and use of the devices would not itself involve criminal conduct, but access to the devices might facilitate supervision of the probationer.
